### **Lockley Lodge Visitor's Center**

The Visitor's Center has gifts, disposable cameras, water bottles, and snacks for sale. Binoculars can be rented from the Center as well. There are *no* food facilities on Skomer Island.

Lockley Lodge is open from the beginning of April to middle of September, Tuesday through Sunday from 8:30 AM until the last boat returns in the evening.

Boats depart at 10 AM, 11 AM, and 12 noon.

**Even if you plan to take the noon boat, you should arrive at or before the Lodge's opening time to secure a ticket onto the boat.**

A limited number of people are taken to Skomer each day. You will be on Skomer Island for a minimum of 5 hours, until the first boat begins taking visitors back to the mainland.

Your landing fee to get onto Skomer is paid at the Lodge - Credit cards are accepted.

Your boat fare to get to Skomer is paid to the boat captain - THIS IS CASH ONLY.

Boats will not run in inclement weather, so verify whether they are running by:

During your visit, you will see puffins, guillemots, razorbills, kittiwakes, and other sea birds. Later in the summer and early fall, many of these birds will have started their migration and will not be seen on Skomer; however, seals will begin pupping around this time.
